RESIDENTIAL BURGLARY

Location: 2200 (Block) Seacliff Drive.

On June 2, 2010 (Wednesday), at about 4:58 pm, Milpitas Police Department officer's responded to a burglary in the 2200(b) of Seacliff Drive. A resident returned home and discovered an unknown person entered the home through an open second story window and stole approximately \$3300 worth of personal property.

Combating residential burglaries is a major focus of the Milpitas Police Department. As summer approaches, it will be tempting to leave your window/doors open. It is important to recognize by leaving your doors/windows open or unsecured you increase your chances of becoming a burglary victim. It is also important to check the areas in and around your home and remove or secure any items which could be used to access second story windows.

We are asking for the community's assistance in reporting any suspicious activity, specifically within residential areas. Such activity could be pedestrians, bicyclists or vehicle occupants behaving unusually in neighborhoods. If you see strangers in your neighborhood knocking on random doors, climbing fences or looking into parked vehicles call the police immediately. Do not try to confront anyone, but rather try to observe the suspect description, vehicle and the direction of travel if they leave. Citizens witnessing in progress emergencies are encouraged to call 9-1-1.
