### **Milpitas Police Department to Partner with Avoid the 13 DUI Campaign to Launch Intensive Crackdown on Impaired Driving**

#### ***Police Vow to Arrest Everyone Found Driving 'Over the Limit'***

(Milpitas, CA) – The problem of impaired driving is a serious one. While America witnessed a decline in the number of DUI fatalities in recent years, the numbers are still too high. That's why the Milpitas Police Department is announcing today that it's joining the Avoid the 13 – Santa Clara County DUI Task Force along with other law enforcement agencies throughout the country in support of an intensive crackdown on impaired driving. The Campaign runs August 20 – September 6, known by its tagline, *Drunk Driving. Over the Limit. Under Arrest.*

The Milpitas Police Department will be conducting a DUI / Drivers License Checkpoint on August 28, 2010 from 9:00 PM to 3:00 AM in the area of Montague Expressway and Watson court. In addition to the checkpoint, there will be several officers specifically assigned to DUI enforcement during the Avoid the 13 campaign.

“All too often, innocent, law-abiding people suffer tragic consequences and the loss of loved ones due to this careless disregard for human life,” said Christopher J. Murphy, Director of the California Office of Traffic Safety. “Because of the commitment to end the carnage, Police, Sheriffs and CHP are intensifying enforcement during the crackdown. They’ll be especially vigilant during high-risk nighttime hours when impaired drivers are most likely to be on our roads.”

According to the latest data, 32 percent of fatalities in motor vehicle traffic crashes involve a driver or motorcycle rider with a blood alcohol content (BAC) of .08 percent or above, averaging one fatality every 45 minutes.

“Because we care about the safety of our citizens, our message is simple and unwavering. If we find you driving impaired, we will arrest you. No exceptions,” said Chief Dennis Graham of the Milpitas Police Department. “Even if you beat the odds and walk away from an impaired-driving crash, motorists should be aware that the financial and social consequences of a DUI can be devastating.”

Violators will face jail time, loss of their drivers licenses, huge fines and may be sentenced to use ignition interlocks. Their insurance rates go up. Other financial hits include attorney fees, court costs, lost time from work, and the potential loss of job or job prospects. When family, friends and co-workers find out, violators can also face tremendous personal embarrassment and humiliation.

“Driving impaired is simply not worth all the consequences. Just designate a sober driver. Don’t take the chance. Remember, if you are over the limit, you’re under arrest,” said Chief Graham.

The national *Drunk Driving. Over the Limit. Under Arrest.* crackdown is led by NHTSA and the California Avoid DUI Task Force Campaign combining high-visibility enforcement with heightened public awareness through publicity.
