Addendum: Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness Commission

The Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness Commission was originally established by the Milpitas City Council on May 17, 1998. On August 21, 2018, the City Council added the advisory areas of public safety, crime, and quality of life.

Advisory Area

This Commission will advise the Council on matters pertaining to emergency preparedness and disaster planning, public safety, crime, and resident quality of life.

Membership

All members and alternates shall be Milpitas residents, OR own a business or be currently employed at a business located within the City limits of Milpitas.

Members of the Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness Commission are most appropriate, but not limited to the following areas of expertise or interest:

- Resident
- Business (may include, but not limited to, manufacturing, restaurant, hotel, commercial, food retailer, etc.)
- Community Interest Non-profit Group

The City Council may confirm a Milpitas resident student representative who is currently enrolled in a MUSD high school or continuation school. This student will assume a non-voting liaison role on the Commission and represent the youth and teen community on the Commission advisory areas.

The City Council may confirm a Milpitas Unified School District Board Member to serve on the Commission. This Member is selected by the Milpitas Unified School District Board and confirmed by Council at a City Council meeting.

Meetings

The Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness Commission shall hold meetings the 3rd Thursday of every January, March, May September and November, at 7:00 PM at the Training Room in Fire Station #1, or a designated location.
