City of Milpitas Public Art Master Plan Recommendations

Executive Summary

Public art enhances the quality of life in the community, generating civic pride and creating a sense of place. Through the Public Art Program:

- Public Art shall be permanently sited and an integral part of the landscaping and/or architecture of a building considering the historical, geographical and social/cultural context of the site.
- Public Art shall be constructed to a scale that is proportional to the scale of the building or property it relates to or is sited upon.
- Public artwork may include sculpture, furnishings or fixtures, including but not limited to gates, walls, railings, streetlights or seating. Public Art may include water elements and walkways.
- Public artwork may include murals, photography and original works of graphic art, water features, neon, glass, mosaics, or any combination of forms of media, furnishings or fixtures permanently affixed to a building or its grounds, or a combination thereof, and may include architectural features of buildings.
- Public artwork shall be displayed in a manner that will enhance enjoyment by the general public.
- Public artwork may include artistic or aesthetic elements of the overall architecture or landscape design if created by a professional artist or design team that includes a professional visual artist.

The Public Art Master Plan identifies key sites over the next three years where public art can have the greatest impact, allow for coordination with existing construction projects, make the most effective use of the Public Art Fund and have a positive impact and long-term contribution to the City of Milpitas. The Master Plan:

- Identifies high-impact projects and existing community public art goals
- Considers carefully the current design stage for the library project, to maximize opportunities for artists and architect collaborations

- Includes complimentary project types that would accomplish city goals and assure a cohesive public art collection

- Interior South Tower of Library
- Directional Signage throughout the City (placement of signs within the Redevelopment Area)
- Outer front area of City Hall
- Pinewood Park: Art in the Park

Public Art Fund

The Public Art Fund shall be used to further the intent, purpose and administration of the Public Art Policy; therefore the City of Milpitas shall dedicate 1.5% of eligible projects expenditures within the City’s annual Capital Improvement Projects towards the acquisition and installation of Public Art. In the event that eligible projects are financed by redevelopment agency funds, the utilization of such funds for public art must comply with California Community Redevelopment Law requirements and be consistent with the Five Year Redevelopment Implementation Plan.

Ongoing maintenance of past and/or future public art projects cannot be funded with redevelopment agency dollars.

Project Administration

The administration of the Public Art Master Plan projects are listed in order of priority, based on design stage, functionality and visibility of each project area.

Project Descriptions

Library

Outer Entry (160 North Main Street)

Budget \$127,500

Description

- The site of the new Milpitas Community Library is an anchor to the downtown area, which will attract hundreds of visitors a day.
- The vantage points of this remarkable site – a large scale public artwork piece would be visible from the Calaveras Blvd. overpass, the Calaveras Blvd. off ramp and pedestrians and motorists entering Main St. from Windsor Ave. in addition to travelers on North and South bound Main Street.

Artist Selection

- A National open competition will be conducted for artists.
- Up to three (3) finalists will be selected by the Selection Jury to develop site-specific artwork proposals and present their models in person.

Library

Interior South Tower (160 North Main Street)

Budget \$227,500

Description

- Art will be selected that can be accommodated within the Library Tower structural system.

Artist Selection

- This project would require the initial artist to work with Group 4 for the first digital designs for the grand opening of the library.

- This artwork may requires artist(s) and/or artist teams specializing in digital designs and familiar with projection technology.
- An open competition will be conducted for artist(s) and/or artist teams in California.
- Up to three (3) finalists will be selected by the Selection Jury and Group 4 to develop specific artwork proposals and present their display in person.

Directional Signs

Throughout the Redevelopment Area

Description

- The Public Art Committee shall collaborate with the Economic Development Commission and the Economic Development Manager to identify key locations for the artistic directional signs that will convey Milpitas' theme or brand.
- The collaborative efforts shall accomplish the goals of both the Economic Development Commission and the Public Art Committee by creating directional signs to retail centers, civic facilities and places of interest, and enhancing the community through public art.

Artist Selection

- An open competition will be conducted for artists from California.
- The Selection Jury, which shall include members from the Economic Development Commission shall select up to (3) finalists to develop artwork proposals for the designated sign installation locations and present their models in person.

- Up to three (3) finalists will be selected by the Selection Jury to develop site-specific artwork proposals and present their models in person.
