### **VIII. Old Business**

#### **1. CONSIDERATION OF NON-VOTING STUDENT MEMBER**

**Background:** In order to generate greater student interest and participation in sister cities activities, the commission proposed the possibility of have a non-voting student member on the commission.

- Jenny Shen, a Youth Advisory Commission member and Milpitas High School student, attended the Sister Cities Commission meeting in August and stated that she would be interested in serving in a non-voting position.
- The Commission made a motion to recommend a bylaws amendment for the City Council's consideration to allow a non-voting student member. The recommendation was approved by the City Council at their meeting on September 15, 2009 and the bylaws were amended.

**Recommendation:** Receive status update and remove item from agenda.

## **2. HUIZHOU CITY, CHINA: STATUS REPORT ON SISTER CITIES RELATIONSHIP**

### **Background:**

Lead Commissioner: Chair Grilli

- Milpitas and Huizhou signed an updated MOU in September 2008 for a five-year term.
- Continue discussions regarding possible student exchanges between Milpitas and Huizhou.

**Recommendation:** Receive verbal report from Lead Commissioner Grilli.

## **3. DAGUPAN CITY, PHILIPPINES: STATUS REPORT ON SISTER CITIES RELATIONSHIP**

### **Background:**

Lead Commissioner: Mateo

- A government delegation from Dagupan visited Milpitas on September 15, 2009. Staff arranged for presentations to the group on subjects pertaining to their current mutual interests.
- The Sister Cities Commission recommended a 5-year renewal of the MOU. This recommendation was approved by the City Council on September 15, 2009. A signing ceremony also took place at this meeting.
- During their visit, a Dagupan City Council member indicated their interest in a possible student exchange in 2010. They also extended an invitation to visit Dagupan in December 2009 and/or April 2010.

**Recommendation:** Receive verbal report from Lead Commissioner Mateo.

## **4. TSUKUBA CITY, JAPAN: STATUS REPORT ON SISTER CITY RELATIONSHIP**

### **Background:**

Lead Commissioners: Arbaugh & Tran.

- The Sister Cities Commission recommended a 5-year renewal of the MOU. This recommendation was approved by the City Council on August 18, 2009.

**Recommendation:** Receive verbal report from Lead Commissioners Arbaugh and Tran.

## **5. NAM-GU CITY, INCHEON, SOUTH KOREA: STATUS REPORT ON FRIENDSHIP CITY RELATIONSHIP**

### **Background:**

Lead Commissioner: Chen

- A government delegation from Nam-gu visited Milpitas on July 28, 2009. A Signing Ceremony was conducted during the visit and the Mayors of both cities signed a Friendship Agreement. During their visit, Nam-gu representatives extended an invitation to the Milpitas City Council, Sister Cities Commissioners and staff to visit Nam-gu in October.
- Mr. David Chang, the Co-Chairman of the Korean-American Federation of Southwest States (located in Santa Clara) is the local contact for Nam-gu.

**Recommendation:** Receive verbal report from Lead Commissioner Chen.

## 6. WESTERN EUROPEAN SISTER CITY RESEARCH STATUS REPORT

### **Background:**

Lead Commissioners: Arefi, Arbaugh & Serpa.

- At the July 2009 commission meeting, Commissioner Arefi asked staff to send informational packets to Cookstown, Northern Ireland, Angers, France and Meppen, Germany. He noted that both Milpitas and Meppen share common interests in technology and a similar population.
- On March 17, 2009, the City Council approved the commission's request to pursue a possible sister city relationship with Hochheim, Germany. A letter of interest was mailed from Mayor Livengood to the Mayor of Hochheim in early April 2009. To date no reply has been received from Hochheim. (Lead Commissioner Arbaugh)
- A representative from Newry, Northern Ireland, sent an email request for information about Milpitas. Staff mailed an information packet to Newry in early April 2009. To date no reply has been received from Newry. (Lead Commissioner Arefi)
- Vice Chair Arbaugh requested a discussion about Derby, England. He made contact with John Forkin, Director of Marketing Derby. In May 2009, the commission requested that staff send an informational packet to Derby, which was sent in early June. To date no reply has been received regarding Derby. (Lead Commissioner Arbaugh)
- Vice Mayor McHugh and Alternate Commissioner Serpa are researching sister city opportunities in the province of Florence, Italy.
- Commissioners Arefi, Arbaugh and Serpa are continuing research on the potential for other western European sister cities.

**Recommendation:** Receive update from Lead Commissioners Arefi, Arbaugh and Serpa.
