- VIII. Unfinished Business**
- 1. Follow up on 2012 Essay Contest**
 The essay contest was very successful and most participated essay contest. The prizes

were very attractive.

Commissioner Chou discussed participation statistics and passed around a spreadsheet. There were some conflicts for children that were scheduled to take the PSAT. Commissioner Chou also mentioned the idea of the print-on-demand book for 9-12 grade applicants to help with their college applications.

Vice Chair Montano suggested that a pre-registration feature be added to help ease the day of the event coordination. She also suggested a participation limit and those participants should receive a pen for achievement.

Commissioner Stephens suggested having more judges.

Commissioner Aoalin mentioned that the refreshments were good and that the fruits were favored over vegetables.

IX. New Business

1. Development of Commission Work Plan for 2013

Staff distributed a sample commission work plan from the City's Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Commission. Staff suggested that having a work plan may help keep the commission focused. Any work plan adopted by the commission will need to be adopted by the City Council.

X. Other Business

1. Friends of the Milpitas Library Report

Commissioner Stephens reported that there was a panel of authors in July as part of the summer reading program. All were authors of historical fiction.

2. County Librarian Report

County Librarian Nancy Howe summarized her report. The County Library Joint Powers Authority met on October 25 and decided to keep the same method for distributing annual revenue to community libraries. They also approved service contracts with Gene Bregman and Associates to conduct polling and Lew Edwards Group to assist with public awareness in preparation for a possible election to renew the Community Facilities District special tax that will expire in June 2015. This tax currently accounts for 17% of library revenue annually. They elected Gilbert Wong (Cupertino) as Chair and Jason Baker (Campbell) as Vice-Chair for 2013. They recognized and thanked departing JPA members Santa Clara County Supervisor Liz Kniss, Councilman Jean Mordo, and Councilwoman and JPA Chair, Lana Malloy, for their years of service.

Payment Stations

We have installed Payment Stations in each library. The self-service stations allow patrons to pay fines and fees in cash and by credit card. They also can purchase a two-hour computer guest pass for \$4.00.

“Read With Me” Kits

We have added Family Reading Kits to our collections. These “Read With Me” kits are designed to encourage children and their caregivers to read together and to promote early literacy. The kits, housed in clear bags, contain a fun and engaging assortment of books, a CD or DVD, a puppet, and activity suggestions. Each kit is created around a single theme, such as Colors, Dinosaurs, or Bedtime, and is available for check out for three weeks. Some of the kits are geared towards babies and toddlers and others are designed to be used with preschoolers.

California Reads: Children’s Art Contest

Children in grades kindergarten through 8 were invited to submit original art to the Santa Clara County Library District’s *We Are America* contest, in support of “Searching for Democracy,” a California Reads program in partnership with with CalHumanities. The contest had three categories for children in grades K-2, 3-5, and 6-8. Winning art works were chosen by a panel of local judges. Winners will receive art supplies, and art work will be featured on the Library’s web site and in displays in the Library.

California Reads: Teen Photography Contest

Teens grades 6-12 were invited to participate in the Library District’s digital photography contest, “Democracy Is,” in support of California Reads: Searching for Democracy.

Winners were chosen by online votes. The winners receive a gift card, and the winning photos are featured on the library home page.

Tablet Tales

Tablet Tales is a new musical, interactive family storytime that makes use of digital apps, eBooks, props and musical instruments along with picture books. New and traditional storytelling techniques are used to deliver a program which supports the development of early literacy skills. This was recently presented at the Cupertino Library with 56 children and 47 adults in attendance. This program was also presented at the Campbell and Los Altos Library and will be offered in a series at the Morgan Hill Library.

3. Community Librarian Report

Staff news: We have four vacancies for the position of half-time coded page, but should be able to fill them within the next 6 weeks or so. The county has conducted the recruitment and received over 600 applicants. The personnel office is reviewing those applications to determine who will be eligible for the position. Once they have done that they will be able to go ahead and schedule the test. Also, our children’s librarian Diana Lara, who was on loan to the Gilroy Library for almost a year, is back. While we are happy she had that experience, we are delighted to have her back.

I am very pleased to announce that one of our staff, Elaine Vaughan, was recently selected as Employee of the Month for Santa Clara County. Three times each year the county library is authorized to pick an employee for this honor. Each library nominates someone and there is a small committee which makes the final determination. A few years ago our teen librarian, Don Phillips, received the same honor.

Outreach: Last month we decided to reach out to the community and help get people registered to vote, as well as encouraging everyone to get library cards. We visited the Pioneer Mobile Home Park on October 1 – a visit that coincided with the time that all of the residents were paying their monthly rent. Later in the month we visited the Milpitas Senior Center. At both, we were very well received and everyone was happy to hear

about the library, but most already had library cards.

Programming: In addition to our regularly scheduled slate of programs, we also had some special events. On November 4 Peter Fletcher presented a concert of classical guitar music. He has been here a number of times now and always does a wonderful job. About 80 people attended that concert. Last weekend we hosted a game day. We are trying different types of programs in an attempt to appeal to the non-users in our community.

Library website: There are now a lot of blogs on the library's website. The subjects include library programs, materials and services. I encourage you all to take a look at the creative and fun blogging that is now an integral part of our webpage. Just today I posted one about the writing contest. All of the winning essays are included.

Library closed days: We will be closed this Thursday and Friday for Thanksgiving. We will close at 5 pm on Monday, December 24, and be closed all day on the 25th for Christmas. We will follow the same pattern for New Year's, closing at 5 pm on December 31 and all day on Tuesday, January 1.
