a. 2019 Housing Element Annual Progress Report and Successor Agency Report a1. *Continued from January 14, 2020*

Regional Housing Needs Allocation (RHNA) progress

Staff reviewed the Housing Element Annual Progress Report (CY 2019), including the applications submitted, entitlements approved, building permits issued, occupancy issued, RHNA numbers, and current affordable housing and mixed income projects.

b. Report on the Pilot Rent Relief Program Staff and representatives from the Silicon Valley Independent Living Center (SVILC) provided an update on the Pilot Rent Relief Program, including households served, trends, success stories, and collaborative efforts.

The Subcommittee directed staff to broaden the types of eligible assistance offered to potential recipients to include items which were not specifically delineated in the program details, but which will greatly benefit the well-being of the recipients. Staff will return to the Subcommittee to further discuss these broader items as they are developed.

The Subcommittee directed staff to add the Subcommittee's recommendation of an additional appropriation of \$100,000 for the Pilot Rent Relief Program at the March 3, 2020 City Council meeting.

c. Koff & Associates study

City staff and Kari Mercer, a classification and compensation consultant from Koff & Associates (via teleconference), provided an update on the summary of similar labor markets.

Staff to conduct further research on cities outside of Santa Clara County, specifically Santa Ana and other Southern California cities, to gather information about housing-related social services programs and positions.
