It collects a production tax of \$9.25 per dry oz of flowers or \$2.75 per dry oz leaves plus an additional 15% excise tax on retail sales (this is on top of sales tax). It exempts medical marijuana patients with a state I D from the 7.25% sales tax. The taxes imposed shall be in addition to any other tax imposed by state and local governments.</p> <p>Other than the licensing fees to become a testor, I could not locate any taxes associated with testing.</p> <p>Dispensaries can sell no more than 8 oz of cannabis to a single person in a single day.
